Celebration of 24 years Foundation Day

This year, the same was celebrated in our office premises. This one-day function was participated by all staffs, well-wishers, Members and advisors.



Acid Attack survivor Pramodini Roul and Saroj's Wedding reception

As a gesture of appreciation towards the courage of Odisha's most inspired acid attack survivor Pramodini Roul and heroic young man Saroj Kumar, the philanthropic Khimji Foundation in partnership with Institute for Social Development (ISD) hosted the Wedding Reception of the duo. Pramodini and Saroj tied knot on 1st March in Jagatsinghpur, her home town and followed by a formal wedding reception at a city hotel where Hon'ble Governor of Odisha, His Excellency Ganeshi Lal, School & Mass Education



Minister, Samir Ranjan Dash attended the ceremony to bless the newlywed along with other notable dignitaries including.

Pramodini had survived a deadly acid attack in 2009 when she was only 16 years old. Saroj and Pramodini met each other in 2014 in a hospital where Pramodini was admitted for her treatment and since then the courageous Saroj had been taking care of her. An innovative campaign had been launched by ISD to raise funds for acid attack survivors by STOP-A-THON . Ms.Pramodini Roul leads this campaign in Odisha. We also demand Government to take action against the illegal sale of Acids in Odisha state.

Sakhi- One Stop Centre completed 2 years



Sakhi- One Stop Centre, Cuttack which is presently located at 3rd floor of Mental Health Institute, SCB Medical College and Hospital campus has completed 2 years. The centre aims to serve those women who are subjected to various kinds of violence. A total no. of 381 cases registered at Sakhi during last 2 years. In all these cases individual and joint meetings were held with the women or the other party (husband, in-laws, and relatives) to understand the situation and also provide the Socio legal counselling as an empowerment process. Apart from counselling alternative support services were provided to many of them like shelter, medical, free legal aid and livelihood.

Maadhyam – Women Support Centre completed 7 years



Commissionerate of Police Bhubaneswar and Cuttack in collaboration with ISD launched an innovative initiative in the year 2014 to address the issues of Gender Based Violence within the existing institutional space of Commissionerate of Police Bhubaneswar and Cuttack in the nomenclature of Maadhyam Women Support Center in the premises of Deputy Commissionerate of Police Bhubaneswar and Women Police Station, Cuttack.

Maadhyam at Bhubaneswar and Cuttack has completed 6 years since its inauguration on 3rd of September, 2014. During this period the centre has addressed many important issues and the served the survivors of Gender Based Violence with a comprehensive package of services like counselling, legal aid and medical support. As a result around 3114 women who were survivors of Gender Based Violence successfully provided with different kind of services during the year 2014-2021.

Launching of Pre-marital Counselling Centre



Taking into account the challenges of a modern society pertaining to matrimonial dispute such as case of false promise, fake marriage, and other form of disturbance in course of married life, for the first time in Odisha a Premarital Counseling Centre in the name of "Together Forever" was launched by ISD on 29th January 2021 , Lohia Academy, Unit-IX, Bhubaneswar .The sole purpose of this initiative is to prepare prospective couples and their family to enter into a sacrament which lasts for ever. Through this centre Various support services consisting of Counseling, Legal assistance, Sexual behaviour counseling has been provided systematically to make sure that matrimonial life is safe and protected.



DETAILS OF ACTIVITIES UNDER TAKEN DURING THE YEAR 2020-21

Engaging People and Institutions for change (EPIC)

This project was supported by Oxfam India. The activities of this project focused on mobilizing the communities youth groups (both Boys and Girls) around the issue of early marriage practices. The groups were trained on the ill effects of early marriage, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and efforts were made to increase the access of education to girl students of the area of Tribal District Kandhamal and Rayagada.

Activities undertaken

Our Focus is mobilizing the communities around the issue of early and forced marriage practices and gender-based violence. Due to Covid-19 pandemic all the activities were postponed up to July 2020. After that few activities were organized at field level following all Covid guidelines. These are :

Training with youth groups (both Boys and Girls)

During the training sessions the adolescent and young people could understand aspect of covid-19 and what are the precautions to be taken at this time. Beside this the discussion was held on social norms which are the main causes of VAWG and interplay of power. And the training module is itself more effective, interactive, and participatory for bringing change in the mindset of the groups. The training sessions were covered on following modules:



- Asamaanta Ke Jadhho Tak- To understand the causes and effects of gender inequality, violence against women and discrimination.

- Mere Panchayat Ne Kaha- To assess the strengths and possibilities of community institutions and elders playing a role in violence prevention.
- Saathee Sahayogi Sewaye- To build connections with the service providers on domestic violence and early forced marriage issues.

- Rishtey Badal Rahe Hai- to enable participants to challenge and change the experiences of gender discrimination and violence against women.



- Balika Vivah Rokege hum- to enable participants to put their knowledge into action by creating a community campaign and exhibition on prevention early marriage.

- Gharelu Hinsa Mithak aur Sachayee -To enable participants to practice a community discussion on myths and realities related to wife beating.

- Mere Gaon ka Thana- To profile violence against women and understand police responses in the area (village and/ or district) .

- Media Kee Awaaz -To understand how and what the media reports on violence against women.

- Radio Bajaile Zara-To assess participant learning's on roles they can play in breaking social norms and preventing domestic violence and early marriage.



- Geeto Kee Dhun Par- To understand how popular music from Hindi or regional films supports and perpetuates violence against women.

- Court Kya Kehte Hai -To understand how the court

functions on VAW cases.

- Nayee Kahaniyo Ka Daur Challa-To enable participants to challenge and change the experiences of gender discrimination and violence against women

Training with women and girls at community level

Total 6nos. of training sessions was organized with women and girls in the intervention area of Rayagada and Kandhmal district.

Topics covered during these training sessions

- Hum Saath Saath Hai- To work as a team to create better impact on the society.
- Main Sundar Hun- To understand the myths which are raised by society on beautifulness.
- Gupchup Gupchup- To understand sexuality.
- Kuch Main Kahun- The view of society whenever a domestic violence incidence happens and how women were given different reasons remain silent in day to day life.
- Balika Vivah Pe Natak - To discuss among themselves. The issues were basically based on many reasons given by the society for child marriage
- Main Kuch Kahun - To understand how to stay away from such discussion which can leads to Domestic Violence.

Making of face masks - Strengthening livelihood security of women during lockdown

Covid 19 pandemic led to lockdown in India as well as Odisha and was a period of stress and anxiety for everyone. Employment was hard to find and at the same time if employed to keep yourself safe from corona virus. Initially we found that during lockdown mask was in short supply and was of high cost. Mask was not available block level. Keeping this in mind it was decided that mask should be making locally. 12 women from 2



intervention districts were came forward and showed their interest in making mask and sell it in their local areas.

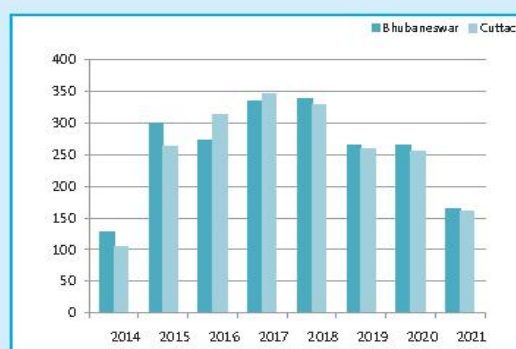
These masks are not only ensuring protection of people from Corona virus but also giving a means of livelihood for women in our intervention villages. Considering the current situation of the lockdown, this initiative has proved to be a livelihood opportunity to many women because the income flow from their major livelihoods portfolio was affected. Mask production was as an alternate

livelihood option not only to support their family during the time of crisis but also to serve to the community as an active women member.

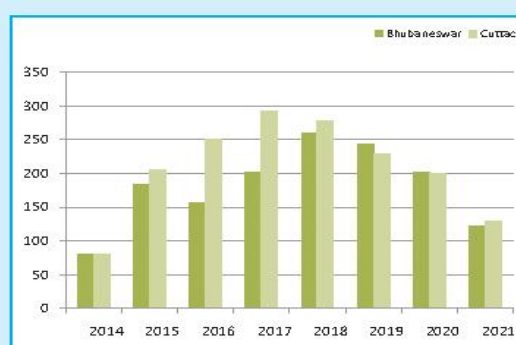
Maadhyam Women Support Center

Maadhyam Women Support Centre has been completed 7 years since its inception in the year 2014. To support the survivors of Domestic Violence, ISD running Maadhyam Women Support Centre in the premises of Deputy commissioner of police in Bhubaneswar and Cuttack for which the office premises is provided by Commissionerate of Police Bhubaneswar and Cuttack in the state of Odisha. Through this Centres ISD support women who are survivors of Gender Based Violence with a comprehensive package of services consisting of counselling, legal aid and advice, medical support, short term stay in Homes, vocational training and long term rehabilitation facility through employment opportunity for women who need assistance to overcome violence perpetrated against them. During this year a total of 4103 women coming to the centre. Out of 4103 a total 3114 cases registered in Maadhyam of both the centers Bhubaneswar and Cuttack for counselling. The case registration and reconciliation status of both the centres separately given below-

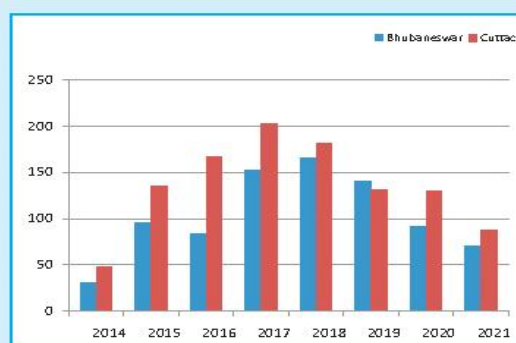

One Stop Center (SAKHI)

One Stop Center (SAKHI) to support an integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof has been completed 2 years since its inauguration on 8 March 2019 . The centre has facilitated immediate, emergency and non - emergency access to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counselling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women. The center space is provided by SCB Medical College and Hospital located at 3rd floor of Mental Health Institute, SCB Medical College and Hospital, Cuttack. The details case registration and reconciliation status of Sakhi given below:

Awareness programme by One Stop Center - Sakhi

Awareness programme play a major role in empowering women through sharing knowledge and helping women to take action. This year Sakhi organised a total no. of 16 programme in different location of Cuttack District. A good number of



participants from various slum areas were participated in the programme. In this awareness meeting the participants were informed that Ministry of Women and child Development, Govt. of India has formulated a centrally sponsored One Stop Center scheme, popularly known

as Sakhi to provide support and assistance to women affected by any kind of violence, both in private and public spaces.

For this purpose a number of measures have been applied. It includes development of posters on various violence occurs on Women, booklet on laws relating to Domestic violence as well as leaflets on various themes. The materials for awareness were development using pictorial representation and demystified language for understanding of the community. In addition to it in slum locations a flex banner

was displayed. The flex banner contained information about the phone numbers of the center to enable the survivors to reach with us easily in case of need.

Towards Empowerment; Working with Adolescent Tribal Girls on Right to Health, Education and Information

This is a project that works primarily with 8-17 year old girl students of 10 no. of residential Government Ashram schools in Khordha district of the eastern Indian state of Odisha. The girls come primarily from Santhal, Kandha and Munda tribes. They represent more than 12 districts of Odisha with a higher number from Mayurbhanj and Kandhamal.



Due to Covid Pandemic for almost one and half years children were completely deprived from school education. All hostels closed down during this period.

We tried our best to reach out with the girls but we realized that majority of the girls do not have access to phones. The phone belongs to a male family member who may be at work, sometimes may not even one picks up the phone. Looking at the situation our intervention started with Community children around the School. Our interventions rebuild a learning environment to generate hope and confidence among the community children.



- It has been observed that there is a community interest increased towards our classes. Even in most of the cases their parents specially mothers accompanied their child to the class.

- We found that some children are now able to build their capacity to read, write with understanding their subject.

The Learning Center-“Bugin Ho” has started functioning at regular basis. Many Resource Persons were giving their valuable time with the students and also sharing their knowledge with them.

In the year 2020, it was not possible for us to make progress due to Corona pandemic. Although we tried our best to reach out with the girls.

- We found tremendous enthusiasm among the girls.
- All girls follow healthy and hygienic habits

- All girls are focusing on their studies
- We are also able to identify special aptitudes and interests in the girls
- Skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing has become stronger
- More girls from the schools where we work have continued their education beyond class 7th.
- Large number of girls attended the weekend programme
- Awareness on personal health care and School Sanitation among Matrons has been done effectively.
- The weekend session was provided for girls to know about the issues of adolescence, which helped them to relate their issues. In these sessions they asked many questions to the facilitators without being shy because answering persons are their teachers. They clarified their doubts and problems which they are facing.



Rakshyak and Punarjivan

The project 'Rakshyak' will work in Bhubaneswar, Khurda Road and Berhmapur Railway Stations. It will rescue and provide resettlements of the children, who are lost, abandoned or have run away from their homes. Family is the best place for a child's overall growth and development. Hence, the primary task after rescuing a child is to locate & contact his/her family followed by comprehensive analysis of the real reasons behind running away or missing. And in collaboration with the Govt. bodies project 'Rakshyak' will put all efforts to reunite the children with their families. Under the project 'Rakshyak', the outreach workers / field workers find the vulnerable children on the station platforms during their patrol around the platform and rescue the newly landed / missing or abandoned children. Under this, meetings with stakeholders like Railway staff, Contractual staff, Shopkeepers, Hotel Staff organized towards child's safety and rights.



Under project 'Punarjivan' the children who are repeatedly run away from home or disobey parents (categorized under Family connected Hard Behaviour Children), or children leading platform/streetlife (categorized under Street connected Hard Behaviour Children), or children who have dropped out of school under various circumstances will be selected and put into 3 weeks and 4 weeks module respectively.

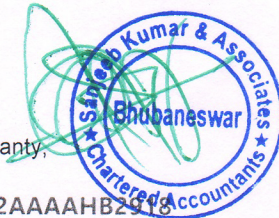

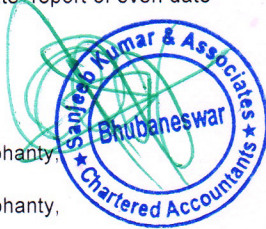
